How to find existing data resources

to address your research question or inform your next study design

Where to look

- ✓ Check out the Global Collaboration's index of traumatic stress datasets / data resources:
<https://www.global-psychotrauma.net/data-sets>
- ✓ Check data availability statements in related publications
- ✓ Search within larger repositories (see "Finding a Repository" below)
- ✓ Think broadly - many different fields collect data about potentially traumatic experiences and consequences of those experiences

How to choose

- ✓ Do the data come with documentation & metadata?
 - about the study / data source?
 - about individual variables?
- ✓ Are there special terms to license the data?
- ✓ Are there restrictions on access or use?

- Topic-specific archives / repositories
